Turn RIGHT (West) onto OLD FREDERICK RD. Go 1.3 mi.

Turn RIGHT (NW) onto OELLA AVE. Museum is on the corner.

Be sure to view the exhibits on Benjamin Banneker, a free African-American born in 1731, self-taught clockmaker, astronomer, and land-surveyor who assisted and later replaced Pierre L'Enfant as surveyor of Washington, DC. Except for his years surveying DC, he lived in Oella.
